Windhoek



Whether due to pure luck or a brilliant stroke of Germanic planning, Windhoek is situated in almost the exact centre of Namibia making it the ideal place to start any Namibian holiday. The city centre is characterised by a large number of German-style buildings, a lasting reminder of Namibia's colonial history. Early buildings such as the Alte Feste (old fort), Christuskirche and Tintenpalast (the parliament buildings) are of particular historical interest. During the day the city centre has a European café culture, and German cuisine dominates.

Namib Desert (*classic camping, all meals + Sossusvlei & Sesriem excursion*)

Sossusvlei and Sesriem Canyon



AFRICAN PRIDE

A typical image of Namibia is one of towering dunes, intersected by dry clay pans and gravel plains and here in the Sossusvlei Sesriem area you will find just such classic views. Sossusvlei's dunes, part of the Namib Desert, have been formed over centuries by the action of the water from the Tsauchab River and the strong multidirectional winds, creating some of the highest sand dunes in the world. A climb up these monumental dunes at sunrise or sunset offers the most spectacular views, with warm tints of the sand, ranging from apricot to orange, red and maroon, contrast vividly with the dazzling white surfaces of the large clay pans found at their bases. The most famous of these pans is Dead Vlei, a stark white pan, dotted with skeletons of dead camelthorn trees, proving a sought after attraction for photographers and artists for many years. Nearby is the Sesriem Canyon, so called by early pioneers who had to use six lengths of hide, to draw water from the cool pools found in the floor of the canyon. This fissure in the sandstone, up to some 30m, can offer some welcome shade with the opportunity of a cool dip in the pools dotted along its base.

Swakopmund / Hansa Hotel or similar (*accommodation with breakfast only + marine boat cruise*)

Swakopmund



Situated on the Atlantic coastline, the temperate climate of Swakopmund offers a welcome respite from the heat of the interior and is therefore much loved by Namibians as their own holiday destination. The country's colonial origins are well pronounced in the palm lined streets, immaculate old German colonial buildings European style coffee shops selling traditional German cakes and pastries. Together with nearby Walvis Bay, the area has established itself as a centre for adventure travel, with dune quad biking, sand boarding and free fall parachuting. The coastline offers great opportunities for dolphin boat trips and bird watching in the Walvis Bay Lagoon, whilst a visit to the seal Colony at Cape Cross Nature Reserve gives a flavour of the Skeleton Coast. A selection of scenic flights from Swakopmund operates to the dunes of Sossusvlei or the Skeleton Coast and for many create spectacular memories that last a lifetime.

Damaraland / Twyfelfontein (classic camping, all meals + Rock engravings + Ephemeral river excursion + Damara Living Museum)

Damaraland



Occupying a vast stretch of the landscape in the northwest of the country Damaraland is an area covering many areas of interest. The arid and unforgiving landscape has influenced the name of some of the major attractions, Brandberg (Burnt Mountain) and the Petrified Forest, aptly named and an indication of the harsh environment. In the southern Erongo area, a cluster of mountains rise

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from the plains with the Spitzkoppe Inselberg being the highest, often referred to as the Matterhorn of Namibia it proves a severe test for any rock climber. Amid flat topped mountains, typical of the Damaraland area, the Twyfelfontein Rock engravings conceal one of the continents greatest concentrations of rock art.

Declared a World Heritage Site in 2007, only a fraction of the thousands of paintings of animals and geometric motifs have been recorded. The Brandberg is Namibia's highest mountain dominating the surrounding desert plains. It contains one of the world's richest galleries of rock art, most famously the

White Lady. During the midday sun the mountain is a disappointing black shale mountain, but in the morning or evening sun the mountainside glows with a starting rainbow of colours as if it's on fire. Also in the area lie a number of petrified trees and angular columns of dolerite known as The Organ Pipes. Another main attraction are the desert adapted elephants found throughout the area.

Etosha National Park



A safari in the Etosha National Park is like no other in Africa. This world renowned park covers an area of 22,000 km² and is dominated by a vast shallow pan of silvery sand, upon whose fringes sparse shrubs, grassy plains and hilly mopane woodlands provide home and shelter for the vast range of animals. During the dry season, May-Oct, these animals converge to drink at the waterholes that occur around the southern edges of the pan, giving the opportunity to see vast and varied species of game against the backdrop of the 'great white place of dry water'- a truly unique experience. More common herbivores include elephant, giraffe, eland, wildebeest, kudu, gemsbok, impala and zebra. There are a good number of lion and cheetah, whilst the more elusive leopard is also present. Some 340 species of birds have also been recorded in the park.

NAMIBIA

Passport and Visa Requirements

- British Passport can enter Namibia for stays of up to 90 days without a visa. Your passport must be valid for at least six months and have at least one blank page. It is advisable to check your entry stamp upon arrival, as on occasions it has been known for visitors to have only been given permission to stay for periods as short as only seven days.
- Following South African immigration regulations; parents travelling to, *or transitting through*, South Africa with children, are now required to provide an unabridged birth certificate, or certified copy of such, for all children travelling under 18 years of age. This applies even when both parents are travelling. When children are travelling with one parent or guardian(s), these adults are required to produce affidavits from the absent parent(s) proving permission for the children to travel or a court order granting full parental responsibilities and legal guardianship or where applicable a death certificate of the registered parent on the birth certificate. Health Requirements

- For entry into Namibia it is recommended to have vaccinations against Hepatitis A, Tetanus, Polio, and Typhoid. It is compulsory to obtain a yellow fever certificate if travelling from or transiting through an endemic yellow fever country and we recommend that you seek official guidance from your GP or travel clinic on the current list of endemic yellow fever countries also taking into consideration any previous travel within the past 12 months. If, for medical/age reasons, you are advised by your GP not to have a yellow fever vaccination then you should obtain an exemption form/waiver letter which you must travel with. In July 2016 the International Health Regulations on yellow fever were amended to state that the protection provided by vaccination against yellow fever will last for the lifetime of the person vaccinated. This means that no revaccination or booster dose is required after 10 years. Yellow fever certificates issued prior to 11 July 2016 will have an expiry date, however this no longer applies. Your current certificate will remain valid beyond this date.

You should not amend your certificate as this may invalidate it and you must continue to take it with you and present it where required. Malaria is endemic in the northern part of the country, especially along the Kunene and Okavango Rivers and so prophylactics are recommended. Make sure you have adequate travel health insurance and accessible funds to cover the cost of any medical treatment abroad and repatriation. Even with fully comprehensive travel insurance, private hospitals in Namibia may insist on proof of payment (cash or credit card) before starting treatment. They may also insist you pay up front, reclaiming from your insurer at a later date. Some travel insurance policies are not recognised by some Namibian hospitals, you should check with your provider if their product is accepted in Namibia before you travel and seek alternative coverage where necessary. Please note this information is only for guidance and you must consult your GP or travel clinic for detailed advice.

Driving Licence

- A UK driving licence is accepted in Namibia. Any penalty points may be recorded electronically, please visit www.gov.uk/government/news/driving-licence-changes for further information.

Travelling around Namibia

- Touring itineraries, whether escorted or self-driving, will most likely include long road journeys. Road surfaces may be tarmac, gravel or sand and in more remote areas the roads may be bumpy, dusty and in poor condition.

National Park Fees

- All Namibian park fees are to be paid locally, details of which are included in your itinerary.

SOUTH AFRICA

Passport and Visa Requirements

- British passport holders, visiting the country for less than 90 days do not require a visa. Your passport must be valid for no less than 30 days from the date of exit from South Africa and it is advised to have at least two consecutive blank pages.
- Please note that parents travelling to, or transiting through, South Africa with children, are now required to provide an unabridged birth certificate, or certified copy of such, for all children travelling under 18 years of age. This applies even when both parents are travelling. When children are travelling with one parent or guardian(s), these adults are required to produce affidavits from the absent parent(s) proving permission for the children to travel or a court order granting full parental responsibilities and legal guardianship or where applicable a death certificate of the registered parent on the birth certificate. Health Requirements

- For entry into South Africa it is recommended to have vaccinations against Hepatitis A, Tetanus, Polio, Diphtheria, and Typhoid. You must have a yellow fever certificate issued at least 10 days before arrival in South Africa if you have travelled from a country with yellow fever within the previous 12 months (for example Tanzania or Kenya) or if you have transited more than 12 hours through the airport of a country with risk of yellow fever transmission. This includes when entry is solely to transit through a South African airport. If you don't have a valid certificate, you will be denied entry to South Africa. If, for medical/age reasons, you are advised by your GP not to have a yellow fever vaccination then you should obtain an exemption form/waiver letter which you must travel with. In July 2016 the International Health Regulations on yellow fever were amended to state that the protection provided by vaccination against yellow fever will last for the lifetime of the

person vaccinated. This means that no revaccination or booster dose is required after 10 years. Yellow fever certificates issued prior to 11 July 2016 will have an expiry date, however this no longer applies. Your current certificate will remain valid beyond this date. You should not amend your certificate as this may invalidate it and you must continue to take it with you and present it where required. Malaria is endemic in the Northern Province, Mpumalanga and northern KwaZulu Natal and so prophylactics are recommended. Please note this information is only for guidance and you must consult your GP or travel clinic for detailed advice.

Driving Licence

- A UK driving licence is accepted in South Africa, provided it carries a photograph and signature of the holder. Any penalty points may be recorded electronically, please visit www.gov.uk/government/news/driving-licence-changes for further information.

Local Airport Taxes

- All airport taxes are generally included in your ticket however you will be advised if any further taxes are introduced. In the Sabi Sand, the Ulusaba Arrival and Departure Tax (currently R220) is payable by all passengers arriving and departing Ulusaba Airstrip (EXCEPT guests staying at Ulusaba Lodge or Leopard Hills). The tax is payable locally by clients on departure from the Lodge. Lodges which use Ulusaba airstrip are: Idube, The Dulini Collection, Inyati and Savanna.

Park and Conservation Fees

- South African National Parks and some Private Game Reserves do charge a daily entrance fee to visitors. Generally this will be included in your holiday cost. However on occasions, this is payable locally details of which are shown in your itinerary.
